Remembrance of Baptism

M: In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

M: In Holy Baptism, Charlie was clothed with the robe of Christ's righteousness that covered all his sin. St. Paul affirms, "In Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith, for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ."

The apostle also writes, "All of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death. We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly also be united with him in a resurrection like his."



PASCHAL CANDLE: The large candle next to the baptismal font symbolizes Christ, the Light of the World; Its large size symbolizes Jesus as the mighty Victor over death and sin. It is lit at every baptism, for "we are buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." (Romans 6:4) It is kept burning throughout the Easter season and always lighted for Christian funerals to show the close connection between Christ's resurrection and the Christian's resurrection to life eternal.
