I Am the Bread of Life— Bread that Gives Wisdom and Life

V elcome! Thank you for joining us for worship today. In our services we gather before our almighty God to receive his gifts and to offer him our worship and praise. Through God's powerful Word and sacraments he renews our faith and strengthens us to serve in joy.

- **PRAYER BEFORE WORSHIP:** Gracious Spirit, bless me today in worship with wisdom from your Holy Word and faith in Jesus my Savior. Turn me from the empty philosophies of man to your eternal truth. Amen.
- **THEME OF THE DAY:** People can debate which physical diet is best, but no one can deny that whatever your diet, you are going to die. No matter how hearthealthy your food is, your heart is going to stop eventually. But in his Bread of Life discourse, Jesus teaches us that he offers food that enables us to live forever. There are foods you might never have tasted if someone didn't have to convince you to try it. Likewise, this spiritual food that Jesus describes is something no one finds appealing at first, but distasteful. Today Jesus explains that we need God to work within us, so that we have the wisdom to see that this food gives life and the faith to find this bread most delicious.
- WORSHIP SERIES: Jesus had fed thousands and cured hundreds, surrounded by crowds. But then we find in John 6, "From this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him." What had Jesus done that was so bad? He said, "I am the bread of life." Bread is a staple food that people eat every day (especially in Jesus' day). In this worship series we examine what Jesus is teaching when he calls himself "the bread of life." We discuss why people would abandon Jesus for making that claim, and we wrestle with whether we would ever do the same.

CONFESSION & FORGIVENESS OF SINS


M: Blessed are they whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered.

⁶Leave your simple ways and you will live; walk in the way of insight."

```

Jesus declares that anyone wise enough to eat the bread of life will live forever.

³⁵Then Jesus declared, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty. ³⁶But as I told you, you have seen me and still you do not believe. ³⁷All those the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never drive away. ³⁸For I have come down from heaven not to do my will but to do the will of him who sent me. ³⁹And this is the will of him who sent me, that I shall lose none of all those he has given me, but raise them up at the last day. ⁴⁰For my Father's will is that everyone who looks to the Son and believes in him shall have eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day."

⁴¹At this the Jews there began to grumble about him because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven." ⁴²They said, "Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, 'I came down from heaven'?"

⁴³"Stop grumbling among yourselves," Jesus answered. ⁴⁴"No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws them, and I will raise them up at the last day. ⁴⁵It is written in the Prophets: 'They will all be taught by God.' Everyone who has heard the Father and learned from him comes to me. ⁴⁶No one has seen the Father except the one who is from God; only he has seen the Father. ⁴⁷Very truly I tell you, the one who believes has eternal life. ⁴⁸I am the bread of life. ⁴⁹Your ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness, yet they died. ⁵⁰But here is the bread that comes down from heaven, which anyone may eat and not die. ⁵¹I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live forever. This bread is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world."

Lord's Prayer


