- C: May our meditation be pleasing to him as we rejoice in the Lord. Amen.



tures that move along the ground—everything that has the breath of life in it—I give every green plant for food." And it was so.





Exodus 14:5–14, 19–22

We have let the Israelites go and have lost their services!" ⁶So he had his chariot made ready and took his army with him. ⁷He took six hundred of the best chariots, along with all the other chariots of Egypt, with officers over all of them. ⁸The LORD hardened the heart of Pharaoh king of Egypt, so that he pursued the Israelites, who were marching out boldly. ⁹The Egyptians—all Pharaoh's horses and chariots, horsemen and troops—pursued the Israelites and overtook them as they camped by the sea near Pi Hahiroth, opposite Baal Zephon.

¹⁰As Pharaoh approached, the Israelites looked up, and there were the Egyptians, marching after them. 


Reading



We have much to be thankful for – an embarrassment of riches! God created us and continues to provide for us, showering us with an abundance of good things. He sent his Son to redeem us by shedding his blood on the cross to pay for our sins. He called us to faith and sustains us in the faith through Word and sacrament. What wonderful things God has done for us! One way to thank God for his wonderful deeds of love is by imitating his love and compassion as we care for people in need. This is something we do in our own personal lives. This is something we do together through the ministry of **WELS Christian Aid and Relief**. We carry out a ministry of compassion in four main ways, which are detailed below. Your special glfts help us minister to hurting people all around the world and lead to many opportunities to share the good news of God's love in Christ. Thank you for helping us show compassion to people in need!

Grant Summary—fiscal year 23-24

Disaster Relief: \$273,090 was utilized for disaster relief. We assisted with flood relief in India and Kenya, helped rebuild several churches in Malawi destroyed by a cyclone, and helped to provide Christian counseling to those impacted by a wildfire on the San Carlos Reservation in Arizona.

Humanitarian Aid: \$581,000 was utilized for humanitarian aid projects in partnership with WELS Home and World Missions. This aid includes food for the hungry, water for the thirsty, medical care for the sick and dying, vocational training, and many other vital resources and services for people in need. **Community Care and Compassion:** \$52,355 was granted to WELS self-supporting congregations in the form of matching grants to assist them with compassion ministry projects in their communities such as food pantries, school supply giveaways, and support for pregnancy counseling centers.

Personal Relief Grants: \$359,343 was utilized for personal relief grants given through our congregations to assist brothers and sisters experiencing a medical or financial crisis.

Total: God enabled us to use \$1,265,788 of your gifts to show compassion to people in need! To him alone be all the glory!
