A Real Christmas Results in Great Joy

Welcome! Thank you for joining us for worship today. In our services we gather before our almighty God to receive his gifts and to offer him our worship and praise. Through God's powerful Word and sacraments he renews our faith and strengthens us to serve in joy.

THEME OF THE DAY: The holiday season can be painful and overwhelming for some. Pressure and loss can feel magnified. A real Christmas, though, is one that results in great joy. Joy, however, is not the same as happiness. Happiness is an emotion. Joyfulness is a condition. Happiness comes from your circumstances. Joyfulness comes from Christ assuring you of his abiding love and your glorious future. Worldly "Christmas cheer" is fleeting, but real Christmas joy endures.

Worship Series: When parents say, "I want to give my kids a real Christmas," they too often are thinking about trees and presents and spending time with extended family. "Then it will be a real Christmas!" Certainly, all those are wonderful blessings. However, none of them are what makes Christmas real. The sad truth is while Christmas is a dearly loved holiday by many, too few know the dear love that Christmas is really about.

The season of Advent helps prepare us for the *real* Christmas. Advent is Latin for "coming." In this season, Christians observe the connection between the first time the Son of God came into our world as the Savior and the second time he will come as the Judge. Advent prepares our minds and hearts, so that we might soon celebrate a real Christmas focused on God's real love.



CONFESSION OF SINS & ADVENT CANDLE

- M: When God created the world, he made the crown of his creation—the human race—in his image. Perfect people lived in a perfect world in a perfect relationship with God.
- C: But mankind rebelled against God, bringing sin into the world and death to all. God declared the wages of sin to be death. We too are guilty, and we confess our sinful thoughts, words, and actions.
- M: However, God—who is Love—did not want to be separated from his children forever. He promised a Savior who would bear the punishment for sin, defeat the devil, and break the bonds of death.

- M: When the time had fully come, God sent his Son into the world. Jesus, our Savior, has paid the ransom for your debt; your sins are forgiven. In view of God's mercy, today we light the joy candle. Though we have not seen Jesus, we love him; and even though we do not see him now, we believe in him.



We provide a few special worship aids and helps for families:
