Epiphany Moments: Blessings are Cursed, Curses are Blessed

Welcome! Thank you for joining us for worship today. In our services we gather before our almighty God to receive his gifts and to offer him our worship and praise. Through God's powerful Word and sacraments he renews our faith and strengthens us to serve in joy.

PRAYER BEFORE WORSHIP: Blessed Holy Spirit, I praise you today for the change you work in my heart in faith. Bless me to see your grace and live by your leading. Speak to me through your Word that I might walk in light. Amen.

THEME OF THE DAY: "This is good. That is bad." We think we know what's best for us but our thoughts are often clouded by sin. As Jesus gathered followers, he taught them that his kingdom runs exactly opposite to the principles and priorities of the world. Therefore, much that we think is good is bad, and viceversa.

Today's epiphany moment allows us to see blessings and curses with clear eyes of faith. Things like success and wealth and health can lead us away from our God, becoming not blessings but curses for our eternal welfare. But there are hidden blessings in what we would normally consider curses: times of suffering, failure, and loss. These force us to put our trust in God and find peace in him. The reality is that worldly blessings can be cursed and worldly curses can be for our blessing.

Our Worship Series: "Epiphany" comes from a Greek word that means "reveal." In the Church Year, Epiphany is the season where we see Jesus begin his ministry, revealing himself as the divine Son of God come to earth in humility to save sinners. In this season we are reminded that there is more to Jesus than what we see on the surface. A review of Jesus' life provides an abundance of epiphany moments where God reveals our Savior to us, and reveals our place in his plan as well.

Jeremiah 17:5-8

⁵This is what the LORD says:

"Cursed is the one who trusts in man, who draws strength from mere flesh and whose heart turns away from the LORD.

That person will be like a bush in the wastelands; they will not see prosperity when it comes.

They will dwell in the parched places of the desert, in a salt land where no one lives.

7"But blessed is the one who trusts in the LORD, whose confidence is in him.

⁸They will be like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream.

It does not fear when heat comes; its leaves are always green.

It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit."

Paul had some infirmity he initially viewed as a weakness. He came to see it as a blessing as it forced him to rely on God's strength.

Therefore, in order to keep me from becoming conceited, I was given a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me. ⁸Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it away from me. ⁹But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. ¹⁰That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong.



for yours is the kingdom of God.

21 Blessed are you who hunger now,

for you will mourn and weep.


²⁶Woe to you when everyone speaks well of you, for that is how their ancestors treated the false prophets.

C: Amen.


