#### **Fourth Sunday in Lent**

Open Door Policies— Grace Instead of Condemnation

Welcome! Thank you for joining us for worship today. In our services we gather before our almighty God to receive his gifts and to offer him our worship and praise. Through God's powerful Word and sacraments he renews our faith and strengthens us to serve in joy.

**PRAYER BEFORE WORSHIP:** Heavenly Father, I thank you that you have brought me once again to your house and your Word. Bless me by your Spirit that I may better know my sin, and better know your forgiveness for that sin. Amen.

**THEME OF THE DAY:** Human nature assumes that people get what they deserve. We assume that what goes around comes around. We assume that God helps those who help themselves. But those assumptions are false. God does not operate on the principle of merit but of grace. God loves all people, and that love never stops. At the entrance of God's open door is not a Father looking to condemn us, but a Father longing to take us in his loving arms and assure us we are still his children.

Worship Series: When adult children lose their way in life, parents discipline in love but let them know the door is always open to be welcomed back. Likewise, when we wander from God, he keeps his door open for us too. But God doesn't just passively wait for us to return. He lovingly pursues sinners in ways that make them long for home. For over 1400 years the Church has set aside the 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter as a time of repentance and renewal in the season of Lent. In this 40-day journey to the cross and tomb, we see the surprising strategies our heavenly Father uses to bring sinners back home. He draws us close to him with loving discipline and an open door of unfailing love.

# First Reading

Isaiah 12:1-6

God's grace turns the fear of our condemnation into the joy of our salvation.

<sup>1</sup>In that day you will say:

"I will praise you, LORD.

Although you were angry with me,

your anger has turned away

and you have comforted me.

<sup>2</sup>Surely God is my salvation;

I will trust and not be afraid.

The LORD, the LORD himself, is my strength and my defense;

he has become my salvation."

<sup>3</sup>With joy you will draw water

from the wells of salvation.

<sup>4</sup>In that day you will say:

"Give praise to the LORD, proclaim his name;

make known among the nations what he has done,

and proclaim that his name is exalted.

<sup>5</sup>Sing to the LORD, for he has done glorious things; let this be known to all the world.

<sup>6</sup>Shout aloud and sing for joy, people of Zion, for great is the Holy One of Israel among you."

# **Second Reading**

Romans 8:1-10

In Christ Jesus, God has already condemned all sin. For us there is only grace and the gift of the Holy Spirit.

<sup>1</sup>Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, <sup>2</sup>because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death. <sup>3</sup>For what the law was powerless to do because it was weakened by the flesh, God did by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh to be a sin offering. And so he condemned sin in the flesh, <sup>4</sup>in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fully met in us, who do not live according to the flesh but according to the Spirit.


<sup>5</sup>Those who live according to the flesh have their minds set on what the flesh desires; but those who live in accordance with the Spirit have their minds set on what the Spirit desires. <sup>6</sup>The mind governed by the flesh is death, but the mind governed by the Spirit is life and peace. <sup>7</sup>The mind governed by the flesh is hostile to God; it does not submit to God's law, nor can it do so. <sup>8</sup>Those who are in the realm of the flesh cannot please God.

<sup>9</sup>You, however, are not in the realm of the flesh but are in the realm of the Spirit, if indeed the Spirit of God lives in you. And if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, they do not belong to Christ. <sup>10</sup>But if Christ is in you, then even though your body is subject to death because of sin, the Spirit gives life because of righteousness.

**Gospel** Luke 15:1-3,11-32

How does God respond to those who object to or are enraged by His grace? He responds with more grace.

<sup>1</sup>Now the tax collectors and sinners were all gathering around to hear Jesus. <sup>2</sup>But the Pharisees and the teachers of the law muttered, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." <sup>3</sup>Then Jesus told them this parable:

<sup>11</sup>Jesus continued: "There was a man who had two sons. <sup>12</sup>The younger one said to his father, 'Father, give me my share of the estate.' So he divided his property between them.

<sup>13</sup>"Not long after that, the younger son got together all he had, set off for a distant country and there squandered his wealth in wild living. <sup>14</sup>After he had spent everything, there was a severe famine in that whole country, and he began to be in need. <sup>15</sup>So he went and hired himself out to a citizen of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed pigs. <sup>16</sup>He longed to fill his stomach with the pods that the pigs were eating, but no one gave him anything.

<sup>17</sup>"When he came to his senses, he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have food to spare, and here I am starving to death! <sup>18</sup>I will set out and go back to my father and say to him: Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. <sup>19</sup>I am no longer worthy to be called your son; make me like one of your hired servants.' <sup>20</sup>So he got up and went to his father.

"But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion for him; he ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed

him. <sup>21</sup> The son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.'

<sup>22</sup>"But the father said to his servants, 'Quick! Bring the best robe and put it on him. Put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. <sup>23</sup>Bring the fattened calf and kill it. Let's have a feast and celebrate. <sup>24</sup>For this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.' So they began to celebrate.

<sup>25</sup>"Meanwhile, the older son was in the field. When he came near the house, he heard music and dancing. <sup>26</sup>So he called one of the servants and asked him what was going on. <sup>27</sup>'Your brother has come,' he replied, 'and your father has killed the fattened calf because he has him back safe and sound.'

<sup>28</sup>"The older brother became angry and refused to go in. So his father went out and pleaded with him. <sup>29</sup>But he answered his father, 'Look! All these years I've been slaving for you and never disobeyed your orders. Yet you never gave me even a young goat so I could celebrate with my friends. <sup>30</sup>But when this son of yours who has squandered your property with prostitutes comes home, you kill the fattened calf for him!'


